Third, a promise, sometimes stored and normally broken, that the circle of those rights should widen. The Civil War lower slavery out by using drive, then the 20 th century floor ahead due to suffrage, civil rights, get entry to to public life. Wars on my own do not produce justice, but they've blocked the worst options from swallowing whole continents.

The dead retain quiet. The air itself looks like a corrective to our period of microphone wars.
