Comparable to traditional live roulette, however usually with three colors (e.g., red, black, and green) representing various payments. High (Standard house edge) **Jackpot** Several gamers pool skins into a main pot. The higher the worth of a gamer's deposit, the higher their analytical possibility to win the entire pool. High (Probability-based)

How CSGO Gambling Sites Operate: The Technical Side
