Armor and Protection

Typical Armor Sets

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early game security; simple to craft, offers very little defense versus guns, but decent against cold and wildlife.
- **Roadway Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances movement speed with trustworthy bullet security.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold standard for late-game PvP. Integrated with a hoodie and pants, this package offers optimal protection versus raids and roaming teams.

Raiding Tools and Explosives

If developing a fortress is half the battle, taking down somebody else's is the other half. The rusthub.com Rust Items Wiki provides accurate explosive calculations, helping raiding parties determine the number of resources they require to breach a base's honeycomb walls.

- **Pouch Charges:** Unreliable, volatile, however cheap for mid-game raids.
