How CSGO Gambling Sites Operate: The Technical Side

Unlike conventional online casinos that use fiat currency (GBP, EUR) or cryptocurrencies, CSGO gambling websites rely heavily on **API integration with Steam**.

When a user wishes to deposit or withdraw funds, the process generally follows these steps:

1. **Authentication:** The user logs in via OpenID through their main Steam account.
2. **Stock Sync:** The site's bot checks out the user's Steam inventory to display their offered CSGO skins.
