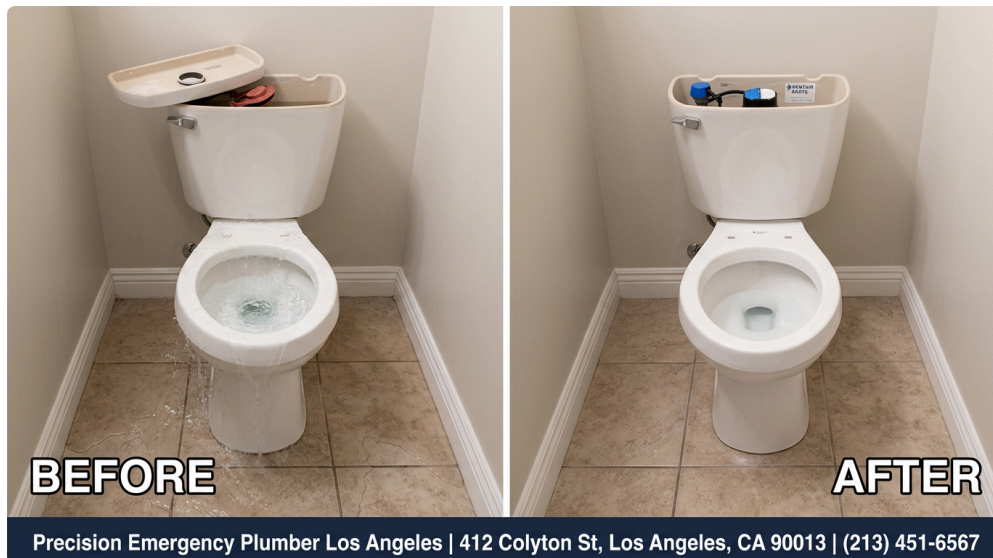
How Do Flow-Rate Measurements Reveal Hidden System Problems?
