Why Does Compressor Failure Signal a Broader Deterioration Pattern?

The component has likely been struggling under the strain of a refrigerant leak, worn fan bearings, or accumulated debris that also damages the condenser coil and expansion valve. Your system's age matters most here. If your unit is beyond 10 to 12 years old and you've already invested in multiple repairs, a compressor replacement adds to your escalating repair liability without addressing the root cause: the overall lifespan of the equipment is behind you. Each repair is a sunk cost that doesn't recover its value because the underlying equipment is still declining.

One of the cruelest aspects of repairing a compressor on a doomed unit is that you lose any ability to plan your HVAC expenses. After the first repair, you're on high alert.
