- **Think About Trading Instead of Opening**-- If you're after a specific skin, acquiring it directly from the market can be cheaper than purchasing keys and wishing for a fortunate drop.
- **Stay Informed About Market Trends**-- Prices for unusual skins can increase after a case is retired. Keeping an eye on market cycles can assist you time purchases.
