Numbers flatten horror, yet additionally they face up to amnesia. Around fifty one,000 men were killed, wounded, captured, or missing over 3 days in July 1863. Under the summer sunlight, soldiers bled into the rocky soil of Little Round Top, the Peach Orchard, the Wheatfield, the sides of Culp's Hill, and across the wide undeniable that swallowed Pickett's Charge.
