Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Noticeable wear, scratches, and fading. This is the most typical condition.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear. Parts of the paint may look cracked or greatly faded.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Extreme wear. The weapon looks heavily rusted, beaten, or almost removed of paint.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others in fact look better with greater wear (understood as "Blackimovs" on particular AWP designs).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity determines how difficult the product is to get through random drops or by opening weapon cases with secrets.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for most collection drops and low-tier case products.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Uncommon; often utilized as trade-up fodder.
- **Classified (Pink):** Rare, extremely popular weapon finishes.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic rarity discovered in cases, including renowned styles like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Growl.
- **Exceptionally Rare (★ Gold):** Special items, including Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
