Business Hours

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Plumbing issues seldom appear at a practical time. In Philadelphia, I have seen more flooded basements at 2 a.m. Than at any reasonable hour of the workday. Old real estate stock, narrow rowhomes, shared sewer lines, and winter season temperature level swings all make plumbing here a little bit more unforgiving than in lots of other cities.

When water is pouring from a ceiling or a sewer line is supporting into a completed basement, you are not going shopping slowly for a specialist. You are trying to stop damage and get somebody skilled to your door as quick as possible, without concurring blindly to anything.

Common Emergency Plumbing Situations in Philadelphia Homes

Other common calls consist of:

- Overflowing toilets where plunging has actually failed.

- Gas leakages connected to devices, especially in older conversions where work has been pieced together over decades.

3. Move prized possessions, rugs, and electronics away from wet areas, beginning with what is most convenient to grab.
4. Place containers or big containers under active drips and use towels to divert water away from cabinets or walls when possible.
5. Take clear photos or brief videos of the damage and the source of the leakage for insurance and for the plumber.

Those actions are easy, however I have actually seen numerous homeowners freeze when water is putting through a ceiling. Having this mental list ahead of time offers you something to follow under pressure.

If you smell gas, the procedure is various. Do not turn switches, do not use lighters, and do not remain in the building. Get everyone out, move a safe range away, and call 911 or the gas utility emergency line. Only after the gas company or fire department has actually considered it safe should a pipes or a/c professional go into to do repair work.
