#### 1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

### 3. Clear Launch Options

  1. Go to Steam Library -> > Right-click **CS: GO** -> > **Properties**.
  2. Under the **General** tab, try to find the **Launch Options** text box.

### 4. Run the Game as Administrator

- **How to do it:**
  1. Navigate to the setup folder (typically C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
  2. Find the primary executable file (csgo.exe).
  3. Right-click the file, choose **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and inspect **Run this program as an administrator**.
  4. Click Apply and OK.

### 5. Check for Overheating and Hardware Instability

High frame rates press hardware to its limits. If components run too hot, thermal throttling or emergency situation shutdowns will take place.

- Download hardware monitoring software like **HWMonitor** or **MSI Afterburner**.
- Keep an eye on CPU and GPU temperature levels while playing. Temperatures consistently above 85 ° C ( 185 ° F) indicate poor ventilation, dust buildup, or stopping working thermal paste.
- If the PC is overclocked (via XMP/EXPO for RAM or manual CPU/GPU clocks), go back to default speeds to check if stability returns.

# Advanced Fixes for Persistent Crashes

- **Disable Fullscreen Optimizations:** Windows attempts to optimize borderless windowed and fullscreen modes, which can trigger micro-stutters and crashes. Right-click `csgo.exe`, go to *Compatibility*, and examine **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Perform a Clean Reinstall:** Sometimes files are too damaged for a basic confirmation. Totally uninstall the video game, manually delete the leftover Counter-Strike Global Offensive folder in the Steam directory site, and download a fresh copy.
- **Examine Virtual Memory (Pagefile):** If Windows runs out of RAM, it uses storage space as virtual memory. Guarantee the pagefile is set to "System Managed" on your main SSD.

### Q1: Can third-party faceit or matchmaking clients trigger CS: GO to crash?

**A:** Yes.
