If a gamer gets a skin in a trade, they can not trade it once again for a complete week. This seriously disrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots used by CSGO gambling establishments.
- **Account Bans:** Valve regularly prohibits accounts related to industrial gambling, leading to millions of dollars worth of skins being locked permanently inside banned stocks.
