When a crash occurs, gamers must not instantly turn to reinstalling the entire video game. Instead, follow this diagnostic list to narrow down the source:

1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the video game crash to desktop (CTD) silently, or does it reveal a specific error code (like engine.dll or memory allocation mistakes)?
2. **Examine System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or shut down processes to prevent permanent hardware damage.
3. **Confirm Recent Changes:** Did the crash start taking place instantly after a Windows upgrade, a graphics driver update, or the setup of new peripherals?

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

Below is a structured breakdown of the most reliable techniques to deal with CS: GO crashes, ranging from fundamental software tweaks to advanced system checks.

1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

- **Action 1:** Navigate to the video game installation directory (normally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Action 2:** Locate the main executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Action 3:** Right-click the file and select **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check package for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.

- **Step 6:** Click *Apply* and *OKAY*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard software repairs stop working to deal with the crashing issue, the issue may lie much deeper within the operating system or hardware configuration.



Managing Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive players overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). However, source engines can be infamously conscious unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied via MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, go back the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to evaluate stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can cause unforeseen video game crashes and memory read mistakes. Attempt disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS briefly to see if crashes continue.

Running as Administrator

Permissions problems can occasionally prevent the game from writing necessary cache files to the storage drive.

- Find csgo.exe, right-click it, select **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and examine **Run this program as an administrator**.

Re-installing the Game

As a last hope, a clean reinstallation makes sure that no residual conflicting files from old updates stay. Uninstall the game through Steam, manually delete any staying folders in the steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory site, and download a fresh copy.
