A lady I paintings with grew up hearing her grandfather inform how he hid a pocket-sized American flag even though his Japanese American family members lived in the back of barbed wire in Wyoming. To him, that flag was once cussed wish, the suggestion that the country may perhaps nonetheless love you to come back even when it had forgotten to. Another loved one has a other story: a flag flying over a county courthouse that fought to stay his vote casting precinct underfunded, the identical courthouse wherein his uncle couldn't get a fair hearing. When he sees a flag, he recollects courtrooms and closed doors.

In either stories, the flag is doing emotional hard work. It stands for aspiration and exclusion, sacrifice and surveillance, the GI Bill and redlining, a moon touchdown and a bus boycott. And, crucially, it stands for the good to thrust back. That duality makes the flag uniquely strong, and uniquely fraught.

A short background of an extended argument

It enables to take into account that fights over the flag aren't new. Americans have disputed its that means, and who gets to define it, since the early republic.

The Pledge of Allegiance dates to 1892, a schoolroom ritual designed in facet to combine waves of latest immigrant families. Both movements were shaped by the politics of their time.

The opinion reads like a hymn to personal judgment of right and wrong: no respectable has authority to prescribe what's

orthodox in politics, nationalism, or faith. In different words, even at the height of battle, the Court said love of nation could not be compelled.

Two generations later, photographs of American flags crammed the evening news as the Vietnam War dragged on. Some protesters burned flags to sentence the war, and native professionals tried to punish them. The felony fight culminated in *Texas v. Johnson* in 1989, when the Supreme Court held that flag burning is covered speech. The ruling changed into close, the state divided, the logic stark. The state won't be able to ban an idea just considering society reveals it offensive.

Then came 9/11, 2001. Flags gave the impression overnight on toll road overpasses, lapels, and rear windows.
