- **Trade Lock Implementations:** To combat instantaneous skin trading on gambling sites, Valve presented a **7-day trade hold**. If a player gets a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a full week. This severely interrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots used by CSGO casinos.
- **Account Bans:** Valve regularly prohibits accounts connected with business gambling, resulting in countless dollars worth of skins being locked completely inside banned inventories.

Regardless of these measures, the industry has actually proven extremely resistant, constantly developing brand-new workarounds to bypass Valve's limitations.
