- **Step 4: Cleaning the Rabbet:** The recess where the glass sits (the rabbet) is thoroughly cleaned and coated with linseed oil or guide to avoid the wood from drawing wetness out of the brand-new putty.
- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is set, the new glass is pushed carefully into place, and glazier's points are driven in to secure it.
- **Action 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A cool triangle of putty is used around the perimeter of the glass, smoothed out, and left to treat before painting.
