

Car Accident Lawyer Near the South Texas Medical Center Maybe you're reading this from a bed at University Hospital or Methodist Hospital. Maybe it's your husband, your mom or your teenager in that bed, and you're in the waiting room trying to make sense of what just happened. The South Texas Medical Center, spread along Medical Drive between Fredericksburg Road, Babcock Road and Wurzbach Road, is where a lot of San Antonio crash victims end up in the hours after a wreck. Right now your only job is getting better. The legal side can wait a day, but it shouldn't wait too long. The Medical Center is also a tough place to drive. Shift changes, ambulances, delivery trucks and people circling for a parking garage all share the same lanes. Fredericksburg Road and Wurzbach Road is one of the intersections The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC names as dangerous in its own crash guides, and Huebner Road at I-10 is only a few minutes away. Failure to yield, red light running and texting behind the wheel cause many of the collisions around here. Once police arrive, usually San Antonio Police Department officers, ask for the report number. That report, the Texas Peace Officer's Crash Report or CR-3, becomes one of the key pieces of your claim. Treatment is where a lot of claims are won or lost. Insurance companies look for gaps in care and use them to argue you weren't really hurt. Clients of the Aguirre firm say the team talked directly with their surgeons and doctors to plan treatment, and checked in after therapy sessions to see how recovery was going. That matters because your damages can include medical bills now and in the future, lost wages, lost earning capacity, pain and suffering, and physical impairment. If you have PIP coverage, it may help with early bills. Texas insurers must include at least \$2,500 in PIP unless you rejected it in writing.

Most Texas car accident lawyers work on contingency, so their fee is a percentage of what they recover and nothing if they lose. The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC handles San Antonio car accident cases this way, with no upfront cost and no fee unless the firm wins. The exact percentage is set out in your written fee agreement before any work starts, so there are no surprises. How hard is it to win a car accident lawsuit? It depends on the evidence. Clear fault, a CR-3 crash report, photos, witnesses and consistent medical records make a claim much stronger. Most cases settle, but the team is ready to go to trial when an offer is unfair. What is my San Antonio car accident claim worth? No honest lawyer can put a number on your claim without looking at the details. Value depends on your medical bills, future treatment, lost wages, the severity of your injuries and how clear the other driver's fault is. Check everyone for injuries, call 911 and get the report number from SAPD or the Bexar County Sheriff's Office. Take photos of the vehicles and the scene, get witness details and see a doctor quickly, even if you feel fine. Then call The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC at (210) 922-0808, which is open 24 hours a day. Can I recover compensation if I was partially at fault? Yes, in many cases. Texas uses modified comparative fault, so you can still recover as long as you are less than 51 percent responsible, although your award is reduced by your share of the blame. Insurers often push extra fault onto injured drivers after crashes at busy spots like Loop 1604 and I-

10, and the firm works to challenge that with evidence. Should I talk to the other driver's insurance company? It's best not to give a recorded statement before you get legal advice. Adjusters can use casual comments like "I'm fine" to argue your injuries aren't serious. Alex Aguirre knows these tactics from his years on the defense side, and his team can handle insurer calls for you from the first day. How long do I have to file a car accident claim in Texas? Texas generally gives you two years from the date of the crash to file a personal injury lawsuit, and two years from the date of death for a wrongful death claim. Some claims, such as those involving a government vehicle, can have earlier notice requirements. Calling The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC early gives the team time to gather evidence before it disappears. What compensation can I get after a San Antonio car wreck? You may be able to recover current and future medical costs, lost wages and earning capacity, property damage, pain and suffering, mental anguish and physical impairment. In cases of gross negligence, such as some drunk driving crashes, Texas law may also allow exemplary damages. The firm reviews every category so nothing gets left out of your claim. What if the driver who hit me has no insurance? Your own policy may still protect you. Texas insurers must offer uninsured and underinsured motorist coverage and personal injury protection, and PIP is included unless you rejected it in writing.
