- **Pattern Index:** A seed number (from 1 to 1000) that figures out how a texture is mapped onto a weapon. For particular skins, a specific pattern can place an uncommon design aspect-- like blue on a Case Hardened knife-- in prime exposure.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter developed into the weapon that digitally tapes the variety of kills the owner attains with it.
- **Souvenir Quality:** Items dropped specifically during main Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels honoring the match and teams.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Comprehending skin wear is essential for anybody looking to buy, offer, or trade. The wear condition is divided into five distinct categories:

Exterior Condition	Drift Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful condition with minimal to no scratches or imperfections.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Very light wear, generally little scratches noticeable only upon close assessment.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint chipping on edges.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, heavy

scratching, and obvious fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Exceptionally worn, heavily faded, rusted, or scraped look.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition because of how the texture is set.



The Economics of the CS2 Marketplace

What separates Counter-Strike from most other computer game is its open, player-driven economy. Valve produced a virtual ecosystem where digital products hold real-world value, sustained by the Steam Community Market and third-party trading platforms.

Factors Driving Skin Prices:

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Just like physical trading cards, the odds of unboxing rare products (like Covert rifles, knives, or gloves) from weapon cases are incredibly low.
2. **Supply and Demand:** If a particular case is no longer dropping in-game, the supply of its contained skins ends up being limited, frequently triggering rates to increase gradually.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When an expert gamer utilizes a particular skin during a major tournament, demand for that product often increases over night.
4. **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade up ten skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, completely taking in the input products and changing market supplies.
