- Valve actively cracks down on gambling and unapproved trading bots, suggesting users risk having their Steam inventories trade-banned.

Stick strictly to main Valve drop systems and the main Steam Community Market to keep accounts totally safe and secure.

1. Do I require CS: GO/CS2 Prime Status to get complimentary cases?
