

A faulty garage door can compromise security, convenience, and access to your home. For Los Angeles homeowners, the right repair depends on the door's age, construction, hardware, opener compatibility, and exposure to local weather. A weakened garage door spring may leave the door extremely heavy, while a damaged garage door panel can disrupt alignment. Why Won't My Garage Door Open or Close?

If your garage door won't open, first check whether the opener has power and whether the remote control has a functional battery. Try the wall-mounted control as well. If the wall control operates the door but the remote does not, the issue may involve the remote, receiver, programming, or interference.

If the garage door won't close, inspect the photo-eye sensors near the bottom of the opening. These photo-eye sensors must face each other and remain clear of dust, cobwebs, or [EM Garage Door Opener Repair in Los Angeles](#) obstructions. A misaligned sensor can cause the opener to reverse as a safety precaution. Avoid disabling this feature.

Obstructions, dents, or loose hardware in the garage door tracks can also stop movement. The door may bind when a track is bent or when rollers have deteriorated. A garage door opener should not be required to lift a door that is physically stuck. Continued operation can damage the motor, drive system, or door components.

Why Is My Garage Door Noisy, Crooked, or Stuck?

Grinding, popping, squealing, or banging may indicate worn garage door rollers, loose hinges, inadequate lubrication, or a failing spring. A torsion spring is mounted above the door and uses stored energy to counterbalance its weight. An extension spring is typically positioned along the horizontal tracks and stretches as the door moves.

A damaged garage door spring can make the door difficult or unable to lift. If one side rises higher than the other, the problem may involve the garage door cables, a worn roller, inconsistent spring tension, or garage door alignment. A cable that has come off its drum can leave the door crooked and unsteady.
