

Garage Door Repair Services in Los Angeles

A trustworthy garage door is important for safety, ease, and access to your home. Whether an motorized garage door stops responding, an overhead garage door becomes unusually loud, or the door will not move smoothly, a professional garage door technician can diagnose the cause and suggest the right repair.

Frequent Garage Door Problems in LA Homes

Broken Springs, Cables, and Rollers

Springs offset the weight of the door. A torsion spring is mounted above the door opening and rotates as the door moves. Extension springs are positioned along the horizontal tracks and lengthen during operation. Both types can deteriorate, although torsion spring systems are common in many current residential installations.

Signs of spring failure include a loud bang, a door that feels much heavier, or a door that only opens a few inches. If you search for “garage door spring replacement near me,” choose a provider that will examine the entire balance system rather than simply putting in a new spring. The correct spring depends on the door’s weight, height, track configuration, and cycle rating.



A garage door cable channels spring tension and helps keep the door even. Frayed, loose, or broken cables should not be handled casually because they may be under significant force. A worn garage door roller can create shaking, squealing, or resistance, especially when it moves through a damaged track.

Professional torsion spring replacement or extension spring service should include a balance test, hardware inspection, and operational test. Never attempt to adjust a spring without the necessary tools and training.

Rattling, Frozen, or Misaligned

A loud garage door may have damaged rollers, unstable hinges, under-lubricated bearings, an obstructed track, or an opener that requires service. Basic garage door lubrication on approved hinges, rollers, and moving joints can reduce friction, but lubricant will not repair a bent track or malfunctioning component.

If the door is uneven or has come off its tracks, do not operate it. Garage door alignment problems can result from impact, loose hardware, cable failure, uneven spring tension, or a damaged garage door track. Door track repair may involve tightening brackets, replacing sections, correcting spacing, or installing new rollers.

A professional safety inspection should test the door's level, reversing function, cables, springs, tracks, fasteners, and opener force settings. The technician can also check whether the bottom seal is degraded or allowing pests, dust, and water into the garage.

Symptoms such as "garage door won't open" or "garage door won't close" may originate with the opener, remote, wall control, photo-eye sensors, spring system, or physical obstruction. Avoid replacing parts based only on a symptom; a diagnosis can reduce the risk of unnecessary expense.
