4. Prize

Numerous gamers throw skins into a common pot. The value of each gamer's skins determines their percentage possibility of winning the whole swimming pool. A virtual spinner selects the winner, implying a player who deposited a low-value skin still has a chance-- albeit a little one-- to win everything.
