3. Evaluate Case Cost vs. Return Potential

In "Crazy Mode," the unbiased flips: the person who opens the cheapest, worst skins wins the pot.

- Try to find neighborhood reviews, reputable withdrawal speeds, and responsive client support.

- **DO** set a win limit. If up by a significant margin, stroll away with the earnings.
