* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the possibility that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) item, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The precise probability for each particular skin within that tier is a separate, concealed estimation.

The table demonstrates that while a lot of cases cost just a few dollars, the possibility of landing a high-value skin remains very low. Players must therefore see case opening as a form of home entertainment instead of a reputable financial investment.
