Rates vary based upon supply, need, and market trends on the Steam Community Market (SCM).

How Case Opening Works

- 1. Acquire a Case and a Key**-- Cases can be earned through gameplay (dropped after matches) or bought from the SCM. Keys are bought from the in-game shop or from third-party marketplaces.
- 2. Open the Inventory Menu**-- Navigate to the "Cases" tab in the stock screen.
- 3. Select a Case and a Key**-- Click the case you want to open, then insert a coordinating key.
- 4. Verify the Action**-- The game displays a short animation that reveals a random item.
- 5. Get the Item**-- The skin is added to your stock and can be kept, used, or offered.

Understanding Drop Odds

Each case follows a predefined likelihood distribution. While precise percentages can differ, the normal breakdown for a basic case appears like this:

Rarity Tier Approximate Drop Chance
Mil-Spec (Blue) ~ 80%
Restricted (Purple) ~ 15%
Classified (Pink) ~ 4%
Covert (Red) ~ 0.8%
Rare Special Item (Gold) ~ 0.2%

These numbers are averages; some unusual cases (e.g., the eSports 2014 Summer Case) have modified chances to increase the possibility of knives.

Do's and Do n'ts

- **Do** set a stringent budget before opening cases. Choose ahead of time just how much you're prepared to spend and never exceed it.
- **Do** keep the skins you like for individual use instead of focusing entirely on resale.
- **Do** monitor market patterns; certain skins increase in worth throughout tournaments or after brand-new case releases.
- **Don't** chase losses by acquiring more keys in hopes of "recovering" cash.
- **Don't** treat case opening as a financial investment technique; the chances are not in your favour.

Tips for Maximising Value

- **Buy cases when they're inexpensive**-- Newer cases tend to be economical at launch, then increase as the supply diminishes.
- **Usage trade-up agreements**-- By integrating lower-tier skins, you can potentially acquire a higher-tier skin at a decreased cost.
- **Offer instantly after opening**-- If you're not planning to use the skin, noting it on the SCM right away can secure current market value before they dip.

Where to Buy, Sell, and Trade

- **Steam Community Market**-- The main platform for purchasing and selling skins. It provides safe transactions however imposes a 15% cost on earnings.

- **Third-Party Marketplaces**-- Sites like Buff.163, Skinport, or DMarket typically provide lower costs and faster liquidity, but validate the platform's track record to prevent rip-offs.
- **Trade-Up Sites**-- Some neighborhoods host "trade-up" services where you can exchange multiple products for an opportunity at a rarer skin, usually for a service charge.

1. Just how much does it cost to open a CS2 case?

The overall expense equals the rate of the case plus the rate of a key. For most cases this is in between £ 2.70 and £ 6.50 GBP, though rare or discontinued cases can be significantly more expensive.
