Once removed from the store, these items can just be purchased and offered by means of the Steam Community Market or third-party trading websites.

Since items can be traded and sold on the Steam Marketplace, unusual skins have real-world financial value. - **Keep an Eye on Updates:** Facepunch sometimes alters how items look or changes lighting engines, which can significantly move the marketplace value of particular skins over night.
