- **The Conservative Approach (Low Multiplier):** Players set an auto-cashout at an extremely low multiplier, such as 1.1 x to 1.3 x. While this yields little, incremental wins, a single early crash can eliminate multiple rounds of earnings.
- **The Martingale System:** A classic wagering strategy where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus an earnings equivalent to the initial base bet. However, this requires an enormous bankroll and can rapidly hit website betting limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses lessened to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the intention of holding out for massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This works just like playing the lotto.

Advantages and disadvantages of CS: GO Crash
