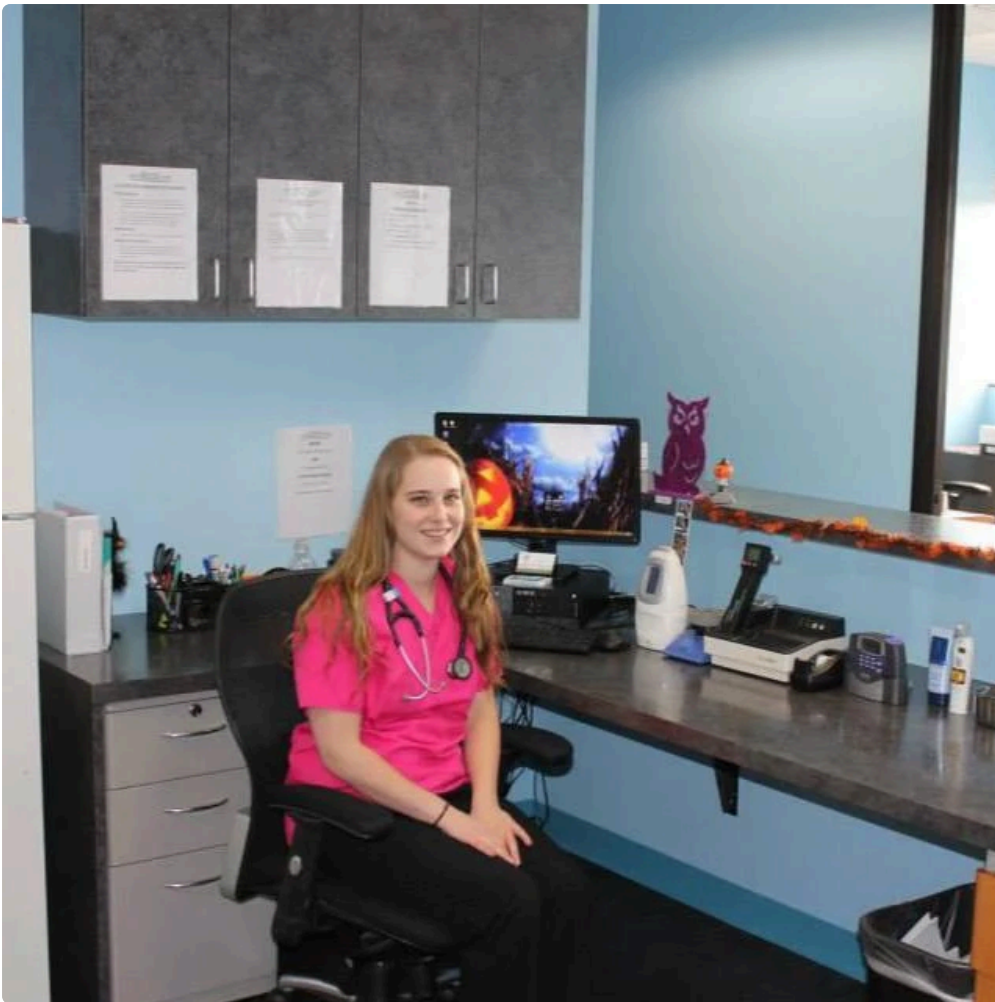


Allergy Immunotherapy in LA: Sublingual vs. Shots Compared

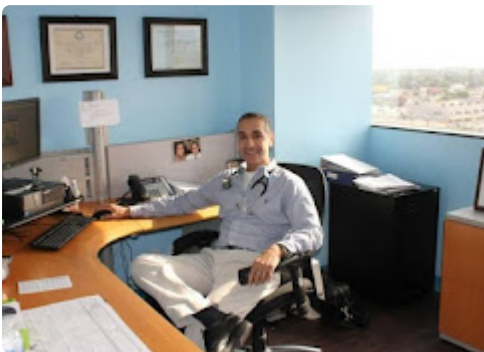
Choosing between SLIT and SCIT: A side-by-side view
