History does now not hand out trouble-free answers. It supplies us evidence, challenging numbers, and a stack of alternatives we maintain making. The distance between 1945 and now is just not a mile remember. It is what we do with what they left us.

The ledger of prices, the ledger of meaning

Start with various since it forces honesty. World War II took the lives of roughly 405,000 American provider individuals. A photo burned an image into American memory, 5 Marines and a Navy corpsman elevating the flag on Mount Suribachi. That shot, taken on February 23, 1945 on Iwo Jima, traveled around the arena. It looked clean, close to easy. History constant the angle and concealed the check. The combat for the island killed

approximately 6,800 Americans and wounded roughly 19,000 greater. Japanese forces fought to close to complete annihilation. Before that 2nd flag ever stuck the wind, Marines bled across volcanic ash that swallowed their boots and stuck their bodies.

Are we forgetting what it honestly cost to lift the American flag on overseas soil? The honest solution is that forgetting requires attempt.
