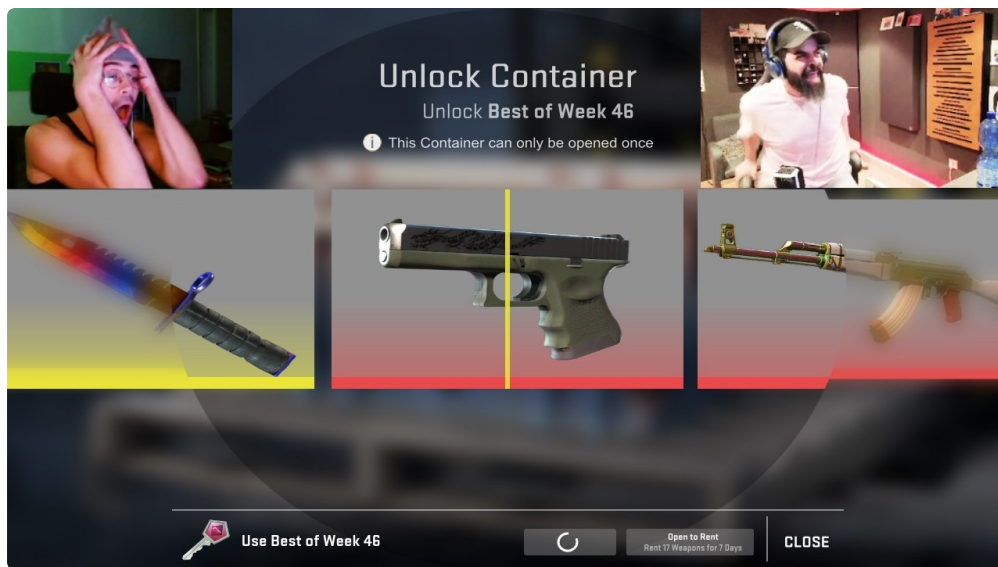

3. How Odds Work
