- **Round Handicap:** Betting on a team to cover a spread of rounds (e.g., -3.5), suggesting they should win the map by a minimum of 4 rounds.

4. Overalls (Over/Under)

This market concentrates on the total variety of rounds played in a map or the overall number of maps played in a series.

- **Over/Under Maps:** Betting whether a series will end in two maps (Under 2.5) or go to a third map (Over 2.5).
- **Over/Under Rounds:** Predicting whether the map will be a blowout (Under 26.5) or a long, drawn-out affair (Over 26.5).
