For non-EU/EEA license holders (e.g., USA, India, UK post-Brexit, Ukraine), the guidelines are stricter:



- Licenses from countries that signed the **1968 Vienna Convention on Road Traffic** can generally be exchanged directly, though tests may be required depending upon bilateral contracts and residency period.
- Licenses from nations under the **1949 Geneva Convention** typically need passing the theoretical state exam.
