- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is set, the new glass is pressed gently into place, and glazier's points are driven in to protect it.
- **Step 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A neat triangle of putty is applied around the perimeter of the glass, ravelled, and delegated treat before painting.
