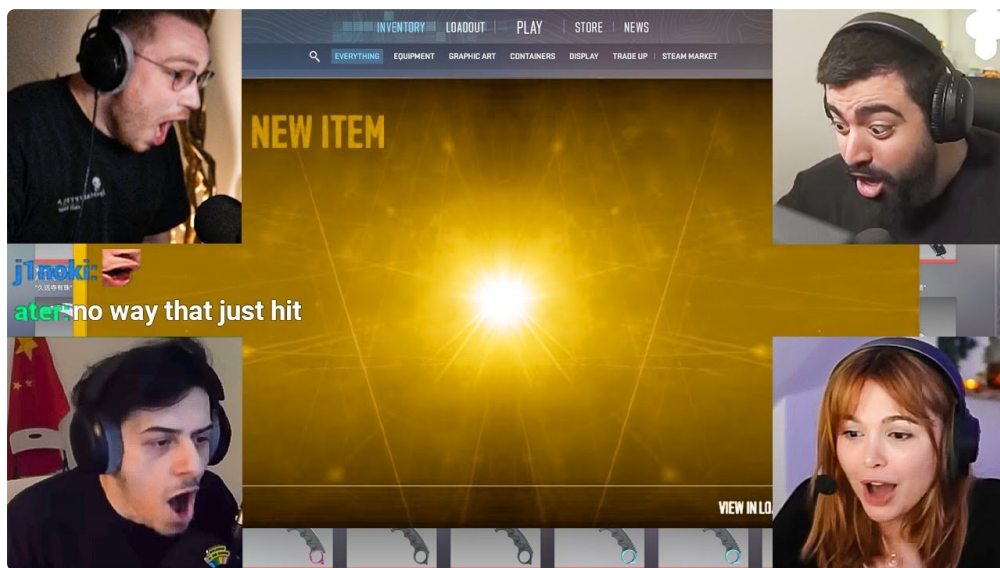

Common Case Battle Game Modes

To keep the format interesting, platforms have presented a number of variations to the basic ruleset.

Video game Mode Description Best For **Standard (Classic)** 2 to 4 gamers open the same cases. The player with the greatest overall product worth wins everything. Traditionalists searching for straightforward gameplay. **Team Battle (2v2/ 3v3)** Players divided into groups. The combined product value of the winning team determines who takes the pot. Playing with buddies and minimizing individual variation. **Terminal (Reverse)** The specific opposite of standard mode-- the player with the *least expensive* overall value at the end wins the entire pot. Gamers who want a humorous twist where bad luck really wins video games. **Organized/ Crazy Mode** Drops are randomized differently or multiplied based on specific conditions set before the match starts. High-risk, high-reward risk-takers seeking turmoil.
