Armor and Protection

In *Rust*, security is the distinction between brushing off a gunshot and heading back to the beach. Armor values on the wiki are computed based upon physical security, projectile defense, and radiation resistance.

Common Armor Sets

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early video game defense; easy to craft, uses very little defense against guns, however good against cold and wildlife.
- **Road Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances movement speed with reliable bullet defense.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold standard for late-game PvP. Integrated with a hoodie and trousers, this kit provides maximum security against raids and strolling teams.

Robbing Tools and Explosives

If constructing a fortress is half the battle, taking down somebody else's is the other half. The Rust Items Wiki supplies exact explosive computations, helping raiding parties figure out how many resources they need to breach a base's honeycomb walls.

- **Pouch Charges:** Unreliable, unstable, but cheap for mid-game raids.
