- **Coinflip:** A simple 50/50 (or near it) head-to-head video game where two players wager skins of equal worth, and a virtual coin flip determines the winner.
- **Prize:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a communal pot. A winner is drawn randomly, with higher-value deposits increasing a gamer's analytical opportunity of winning the entire pot.

Comparing CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Online Casinos

While both include wagering, CS2 gambling differs significantly from traditional online gambling in terms of currency, ease of access, and community combination.
