Wear Condition Drift Value Range Visual Characteristics **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine, perfect surface with minimal to no scratches. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Extremely light wear, generally a few small scuffs on close assessment. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches and use on prominent edges and paint. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, paint fading, and visible scratches throughout the body. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look surprisingly cool in this condition!)

The Anatomy of the CS2 Skin Market

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is one of the most fascinating micro-economies in video gaming history. Powered by the Steam Community Market and different third-party trading and cash-out platforms, rare virtual items can command costs varying from a few cents to hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Elements That Drive Skin Prices

- **Rarity (Quality Tiers):** Rarity is the primary chauffeur of value. Skins are categorized from Consumer (white) approximately Covert (red), with Special Rare items (knives and gloves) sitting at the very top.
