

Why December looks the same every year

A week or so after Thanksgiving, the box of holiday lights comes out of the garage. Half the strands are knotted, a whole run stays dark, and somebody is about to climb a ladder in the cold. You put up with it because the house looks good lit, though the setup is nobody's favorite part. Then, once the season ends, you climb up and undo it.

A simple explanation of permanent Christmas lights

Permanent holiday lighting solves it a different way. Instead of hanging strands every season, a low profile LED track is installed once along the roofline and left in place. Because the track is color matched to your fascia, it reads as part of the roofline in daylight. Control lives in an app on your phone. Red and green in December, plain warm white on a normal Tuesday, and whatever you want in between.

What that changes for you

The obvious win is not owning the ladder job anymore. The less obvious win is that the lights earn their keep the other eleven months. A soft white glow on the roofline makes the front of the house readable at night. Birthdays, team colors on a Saturday, Halloween, an ordinary weeknight: same system, different setting.

Fair questions to ask

Everybody asks the same thing first. Nobody wants Christmas hardware visible on the front of the house all summer. The color matched track is the answer to that. It is mounted tight to the trim and matched to your trim color, so at noon from the sidewalk it looks like trim. The second question is about support. Ask what support looks like two years after the install, because that answer says more than the brochure does.

Permanent versus traditional strands

Traditional lights are not obsolete. If you look forward to it, or you only want lights every few years, traditional lighting is the right call. Permanent lighting makes sense when you know you will do this every year, and when you want the roofline lit on ordinary nights too. Either way, an installer worth hiring will tell you which one fits your house.

Weighing the spend

Nobody can quote permanent Christmas lights sight unseen, and a number given over the phone is a guess. The better question is what the next five Decembers cost you, in money and in Saturdays, not what one line costs today. Count what you already [permanent christmas lights](#) spend on strands, replacements and the hours it takes. Then ask what it is worth to have the roofline lit on ordinary nights too, because that is the part the comparison usually misses. The other half of the answer is the company. The cheap quote is often the one with no plan behind it, which is where the difference shows up at night.

How to find out what it would cost

Because no two rooflines are the same, the design comes before the number. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
