1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the video game crash to desktop (CTD) calmly, or does it show a specific error code (like engine.dll or memory allowance mistakes)?
2. **Examine System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or close down processes to avoid long-term hardware damage.

3. **Confirm Recent Changes:** Did the crash start taking place instantly after a Windows upgrade, a graphics chauffeur update, or the setup of brand-new peripherals?

4. Disable Fullscreen Optimizations

Windows makes use of an internal feature called "Fullscreen Optimizations" to handle borderless windowed modes, which can periodically disrupt DirectX rendering in older source engine games.

- **Step 1:** Navigate to the video game installation directory (generally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Action 2:** Locate the primary executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Step 3:** Right-click the file and choose **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check the box for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Step 6:** Click *Apply* and *OK*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard software fixes stop working to resolve the crashing problem, the problem might lie much deeper within the os or hardware setup.

Handling Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive gamers overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). Nevertheless, source engines can be notoriously conscious unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock used via MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, revert the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to check stability.

Running as Administrator

Reinstalling the Game
