The Mechanics Behind CS2 Casinos

1. The Steam Web API and Bot Trades

CS2 casinos do not link straight to Valve's servers for monetary deals. Instead, they utilize the Steam Web API to help with peer-to-peer trades or bot-controlled stock transfers. When a player deposits a skin, a trade offer is sent to a designated automated bot account.
