Automotive, residential, and commercial calls are not the same

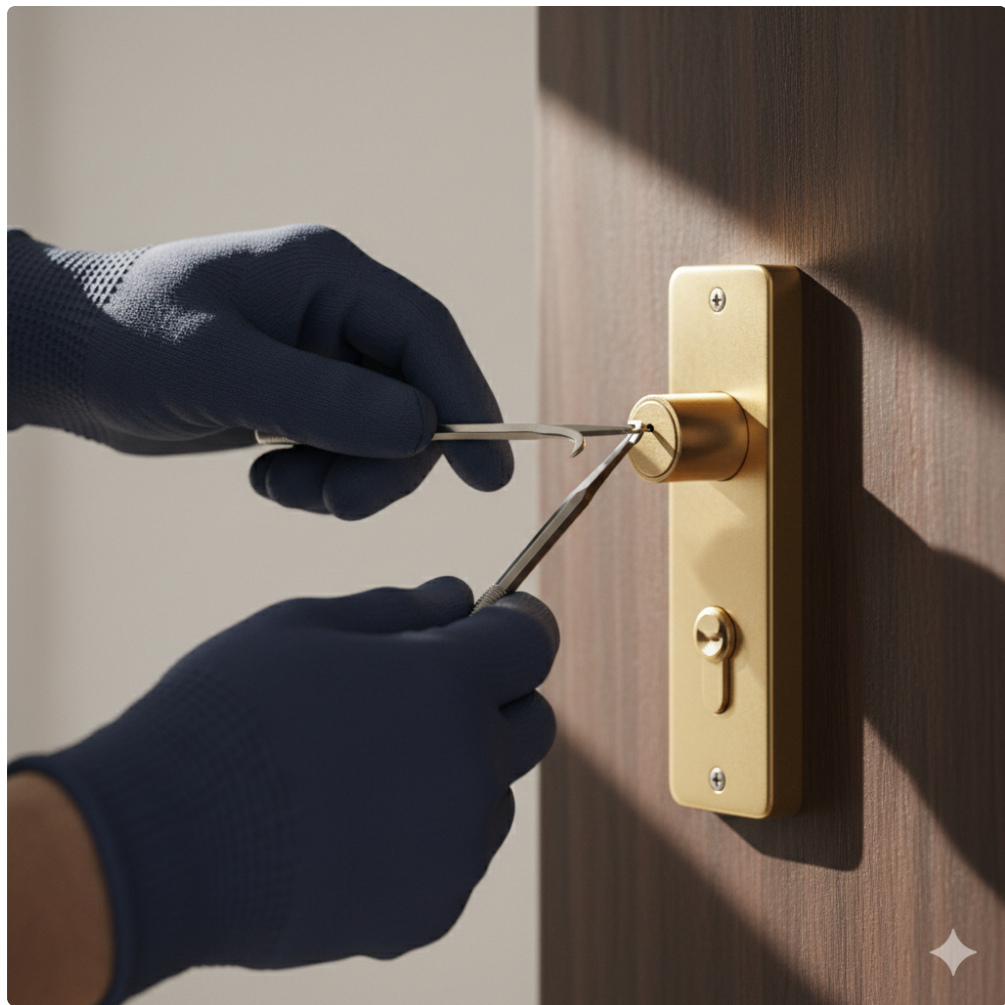
