Organic growth holds moisture against shingles and siding. Pollen and airborne dust settle into textured surfaces and make them age faster than they should. Winter debris gets into seams and corners. Once that buildup sets in, it can shorten the life of exterior materials and make maintenance more expensive down the line.

On driveways and walkways, that can mean tire marks, leaf tannins, mildew, and moss. On siding, it can mean algae, spider webs, dust, and pollution film. For many homeowners, the trigger is visible staining. But there are subtler signs that cleaning is overdue. Trim begins to look dull before the main siding does. Steps get slick after rain. North-facing walls stay shaded and start to discolor. Gutters collect grime at the edges. A fence that once looked crisp starts to take on a gray cast. Those are all small clues that an exterior is holding dirt in places where normal rain will not help much.

That is why roof washing should generally rely on low-pressure methods and the right detergents rather than brute force.

House washing has its own judgment calls. Vinyl siding can often handle a careful rinse, but water still needs to move with the contours of the siding, not against them. Painted wood is more delicate. Brick can hide loose mortar, so it needs attention at joints and transitions. Window seals, light fixtures, and vent openings all need protection. A professional approach respects those weak points instead of treating them as minor details.

There is also a practical rhythm to the work. A good cleaner does not just spray and hope. They read the surface. They check for oxidation on siding. They notice whether algae is feeding in shaded areas or whether the discoloration is just residue from old runoff. They notice if a roof has an unusual amount of debris in one valley, which may suggest drainage trouble. That kind of observation is worth more than a generic promise of a bright finish.

Local landmarks, local standards

Moisture is another trade-off. On a dry, breezy day, surfaces dry quickly and the work progresses smoothly. On a humid morning, detergents may need a little more time, and rinsing must be managed carefully to keep streaks from settling into shaded areas. Trees are beautiful, but they are also part of the cleaning equation. A house tucked under heavy canopy will usually need more frequent attention than one with full sun exposure.

There is also the question of frequency. Some properties need an annual wash. Others can go longer, especially if they are open to sun and wind, or if they have newer finishes that resist staining better. But waiting for a surface to look bad enough can be the expensive approach.
