2. The Low Multiplier Strategy (Auto-Cashout)

- **Risk Level:** Low per round, but vulnerable to abrupt 1.00 x crashes ("immediate busts") that wipe out accumulated profits in a single round.

3. The Reverse Martingale (Paroli)

- **How it works:** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, riding hot streaks while keeping losses very little during cold streaks.
- **Danger Level:** Moderate. Needs discipline to leave after a few consecutive wins.
