

Garage door repair in Los Angeles can cover anything from adjusting a misaligned track to installing a replacement for a broken spring or installing a new door. 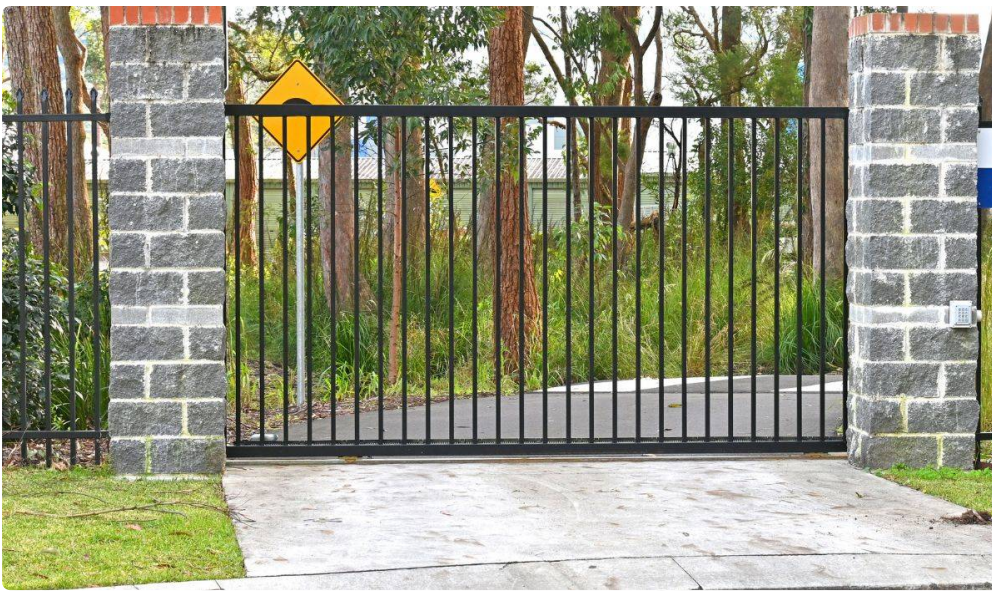
