Why Does a Legitimate Plumber Need Permits for Your Emergency?

What Code Requirements Protect You When Permits Are Pulled?

Permits matter because they enforce standards that keep your home safe. Code requires backflow prevention on potable water connections so contaminated water doesn't flow backward into your supply. It mandates that water heater T&P valves discharge within 6 inches of the floor to prevent scalding injuries. Drain lines must slope at minimum 1/4 inch per foot, and every fixture drain needs a trap to block sewer gases. Clean-out access is required every 100 feet on horizontal drains so future clogs can be cleared without tearing into walls. Once a permit is closed by the inspector, you have a permanent record that your repair meets code. That record becomes part of your home's history. If you ever sell, a buyer's inspector won't find unpermitted work hiding in your walls. If you file an insurance claim for water damage, your insurer can verify that the original repair was done correctly and wasn't the cause of a later failure. Inspection records also protect you legally if someone is injured in your home—they prove you maintained your plumbing system to city standards.

Unlicensed plumbers leave no record. They also leave you defenseless. If a guest slips on water from a failed drain, you have no proof the installation met code.
