- Can you price this from pictures, and what's your variety by load size?

- Are you guaranteed with basic liability and workers' compensation, and can you email the certificate?

- Will you be able to finish this in one see with the truck and team you're sending?

If a company responds to these quickly and plainly, you're most likely dealing with pros. If they dodge, stall, or complicate simple questions, move on.

Getting your area ready: Prep that saves time and money
