- **Over/Under Maps:** Betting whether a series will end in two maps (Under 2.5) or go to a 3rd map (Over 2.5).
- **Over/Under Rounds:** Predicting whether the map will be a blowout (Under 26.5) or a long, drawn-out affair (Over 26.5).
