

How much does garage door repair cost in Los Angeles?

The **garage door repair cost** in Los Angeles depends on the failed component, the type and size of the door, accessibility, and whether the work is scheduled during regular hours. A minor adjustment or lubrication may cost less than replacing a broken cable, spring, roller, track, or opener. More extensive repairs can come close to the cost of a new door.
