When is drywall actually dry enough to be considered safe again

A properly dried drywall board should read between 6 and 12 percent moisture content—anything above that signals incomplete drying and ongoing risk.

What Happens When Moisture Readings Show Pockets That Won't Dry on Their Own?

Sometimes standard air drying isn't enough. If moisture readings remain elevated after 48 to 72 hours of normal ventilation and dehumidification, it means water has penetrated deeper than surface layers. Drywall behind baseboards, inside wall cavities, and under flooring can trap moisture for weeks if left unaddressed. When readings plateau or don't improve, what to expect is targeted intervention—removing trim, creating airflow channels, or extracting water from structural cavities.

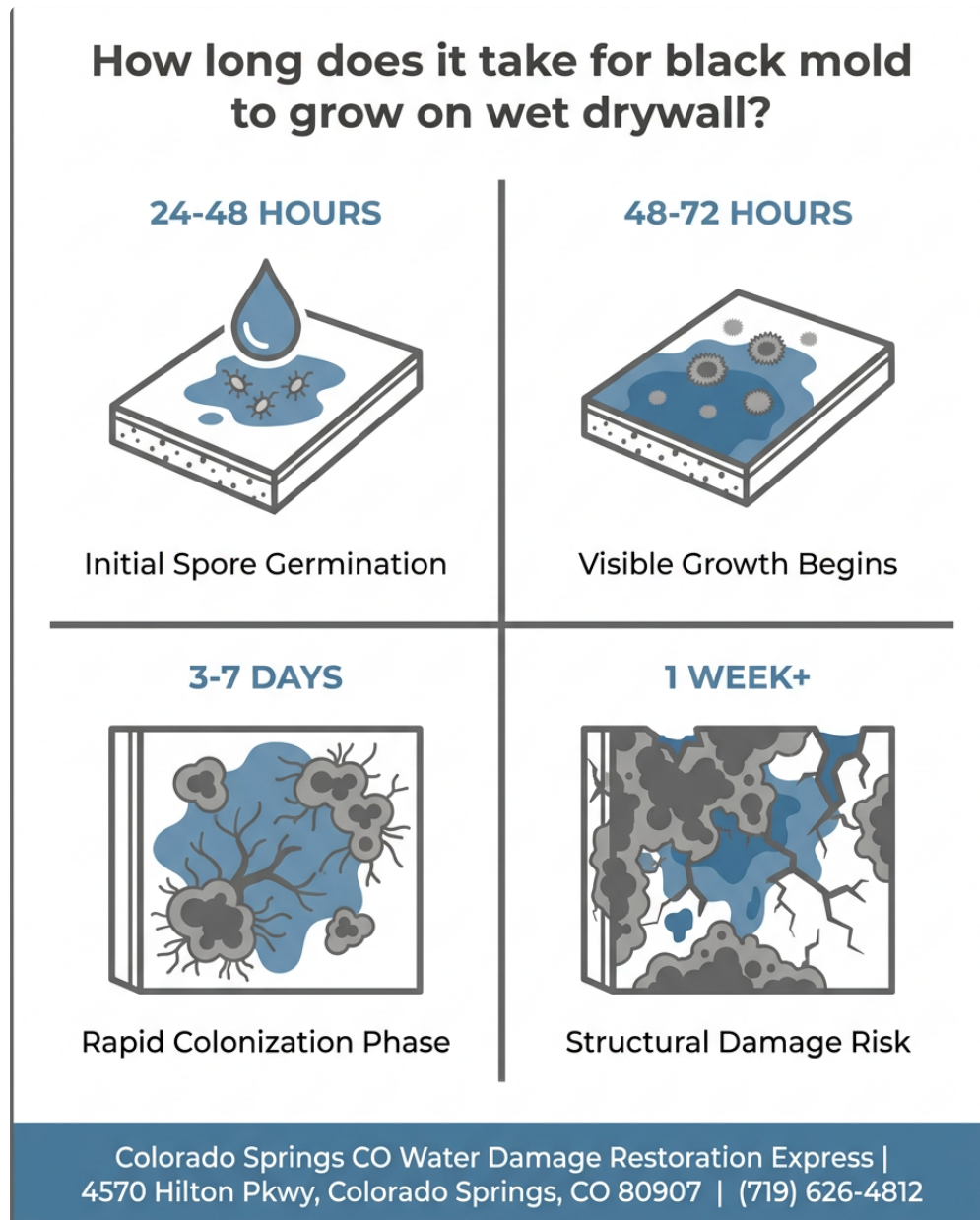
