Non-porous surfaces like tile, concrete, or metal studs can be encapsulated and reused. Industrial encapsulation involves applying specialized coatings to framing, concrete, and other salvageable surfaces. This step typically adds 1 to 3 days depending on the square footage and access. The encapsulation must cure before we can clear the space and remove containment barriers.
